What is a digital library?



“A digital library is an institution that performs and/or supports (at least) the functions of a library in the context of a distributed, networked collection of information objects in digital form”

A Digital Library is thus ...



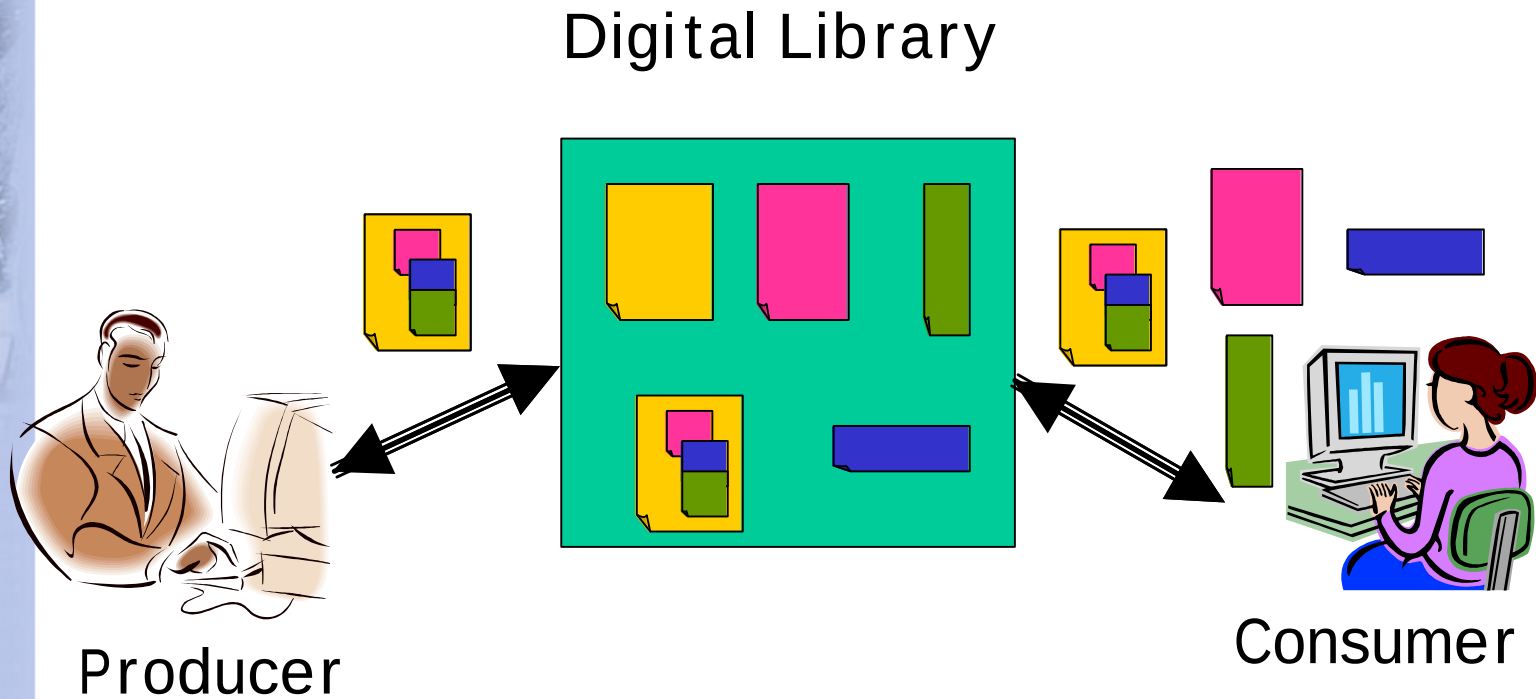

The functions of a library

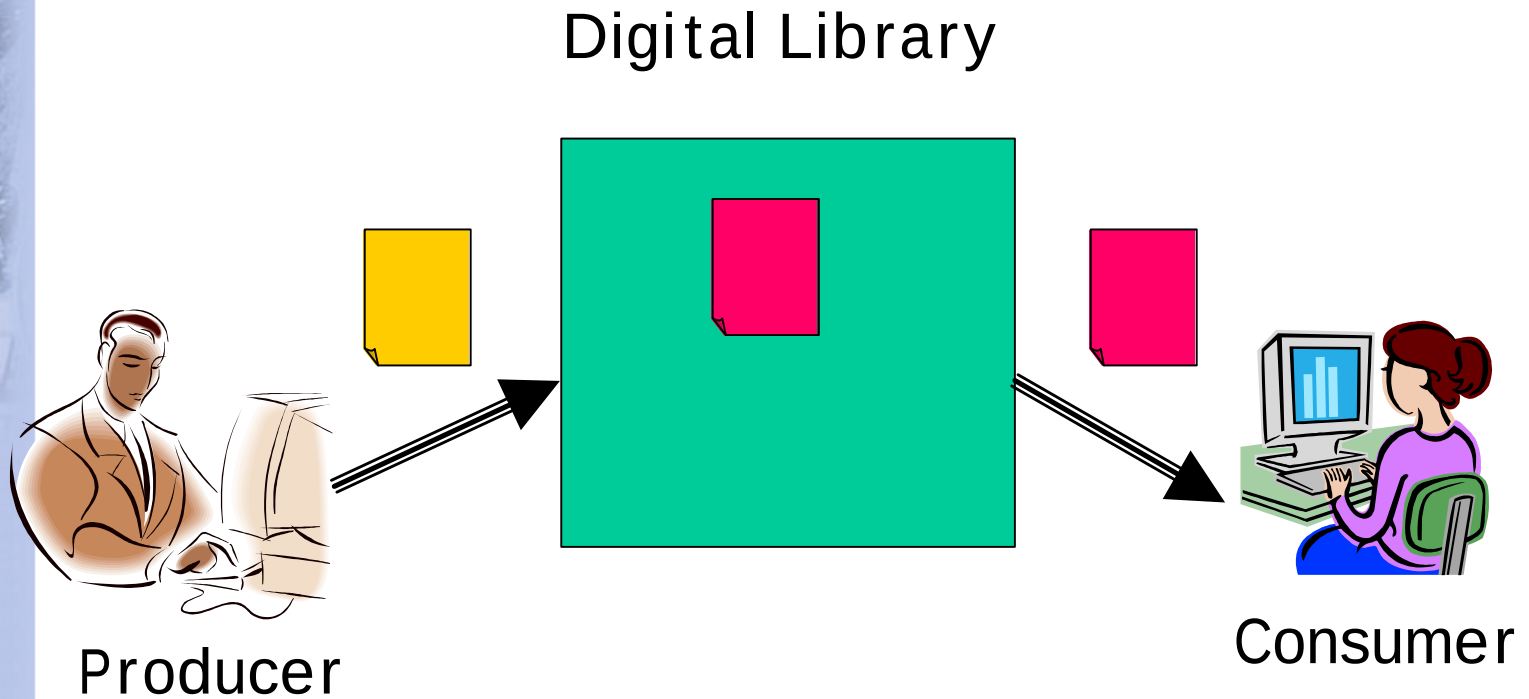


- ❖ Selecting, collecting, preserving, organizing, representing, providing controlled access to, ensuring knowledge of, and disseminating information objects
- ❖ Mediating and supporting interaction between information users and information objects

DL as a communication means



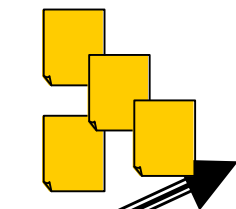
Digital Library as a mediator



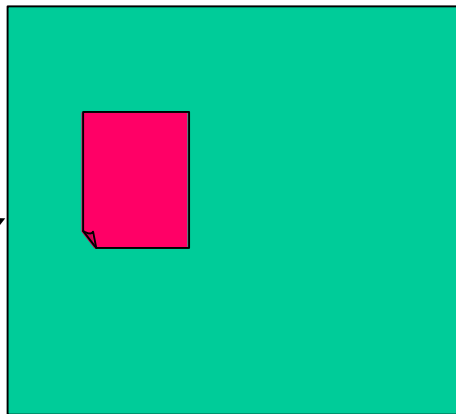


- ❖ It is a software tool for creating digital libraries
- ❖ A digital library is created by selecting a number of configuration parameters (query language, metadata formats, source archives, etc) and then either submitting the content or harvesting it from existing sources
- ❖ The parameters can be changed dynamically without switching off the digital library

System architecture: the past

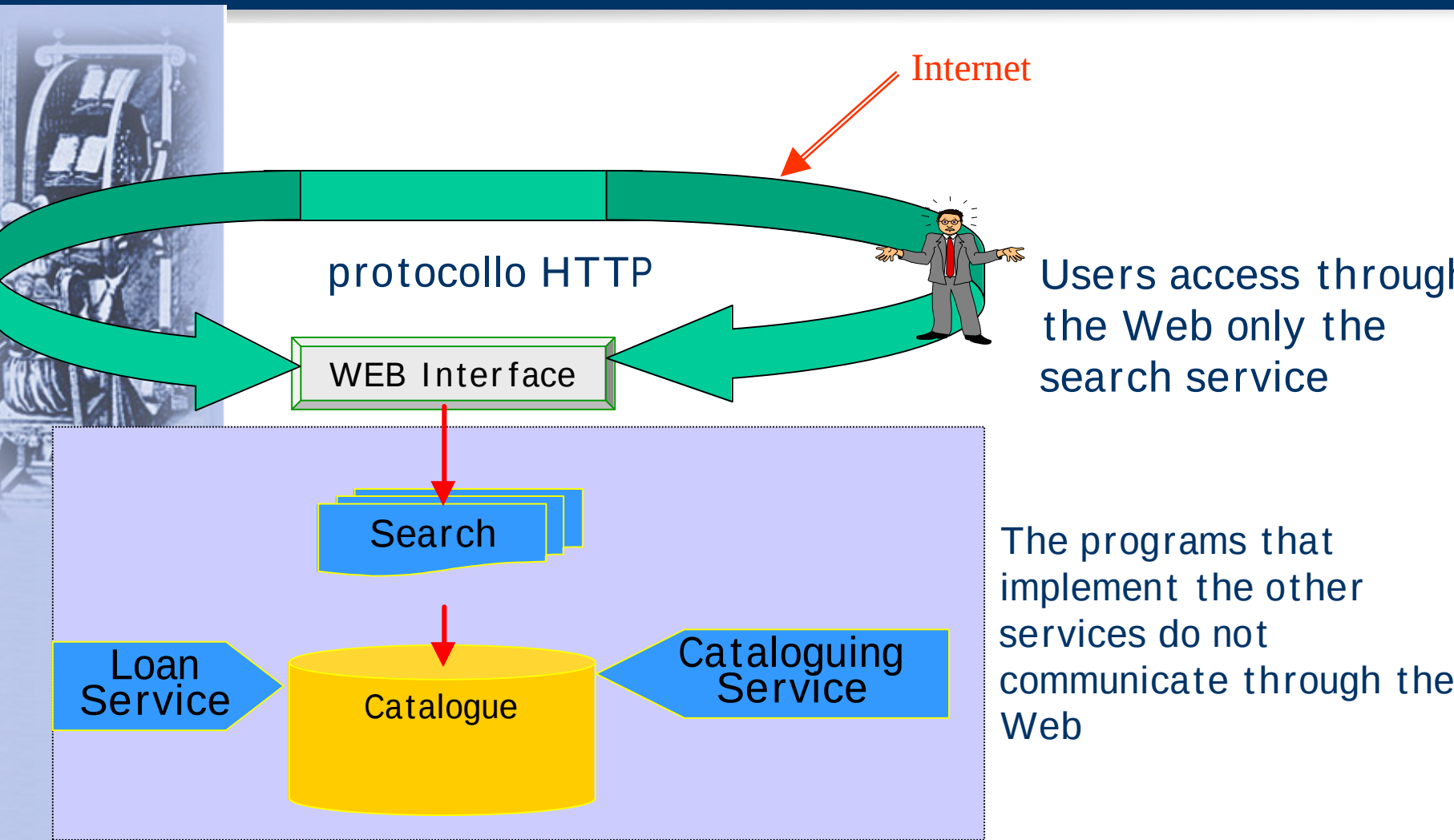


From a “direct”
communication (on-line)



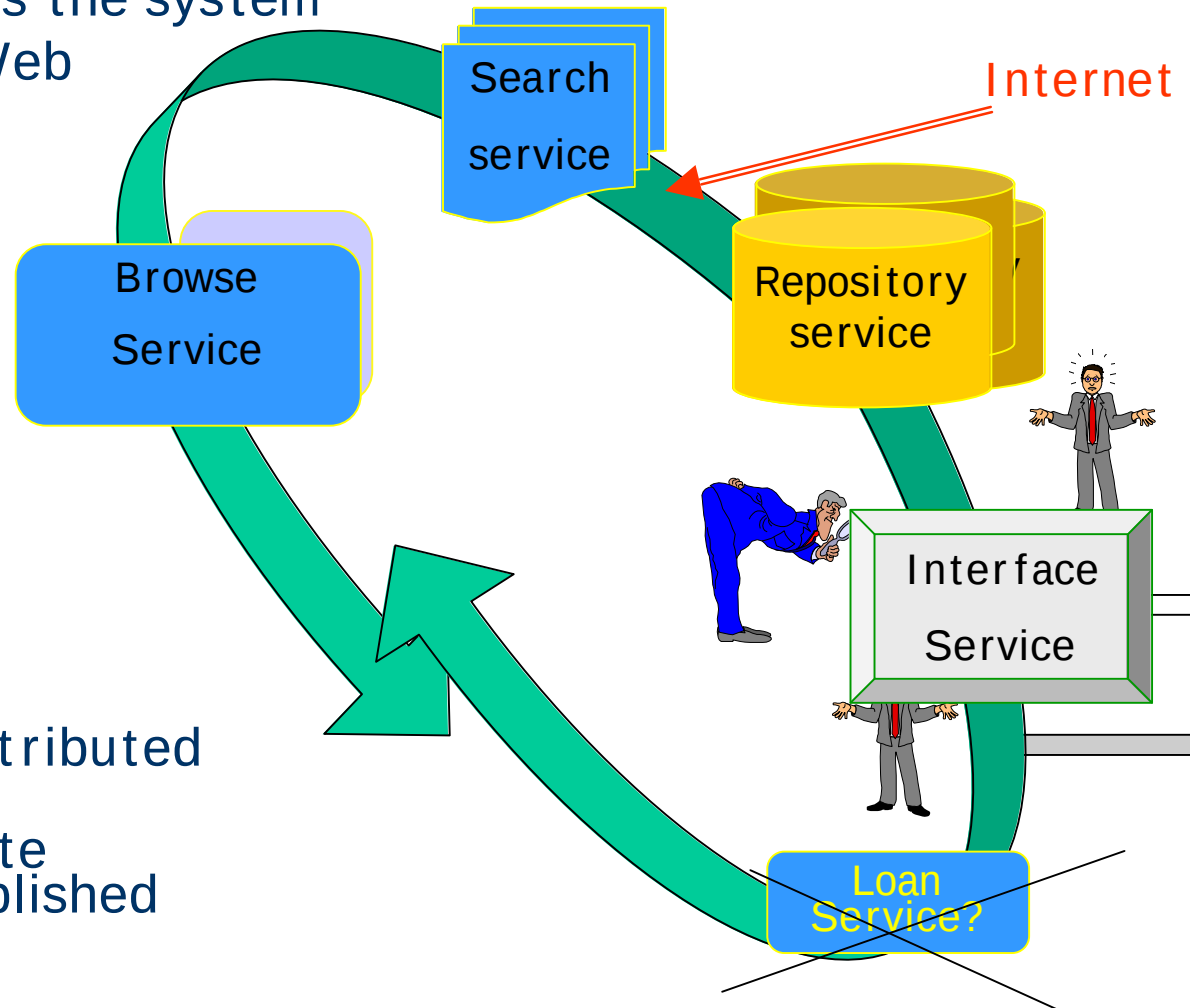

Distributed architecture

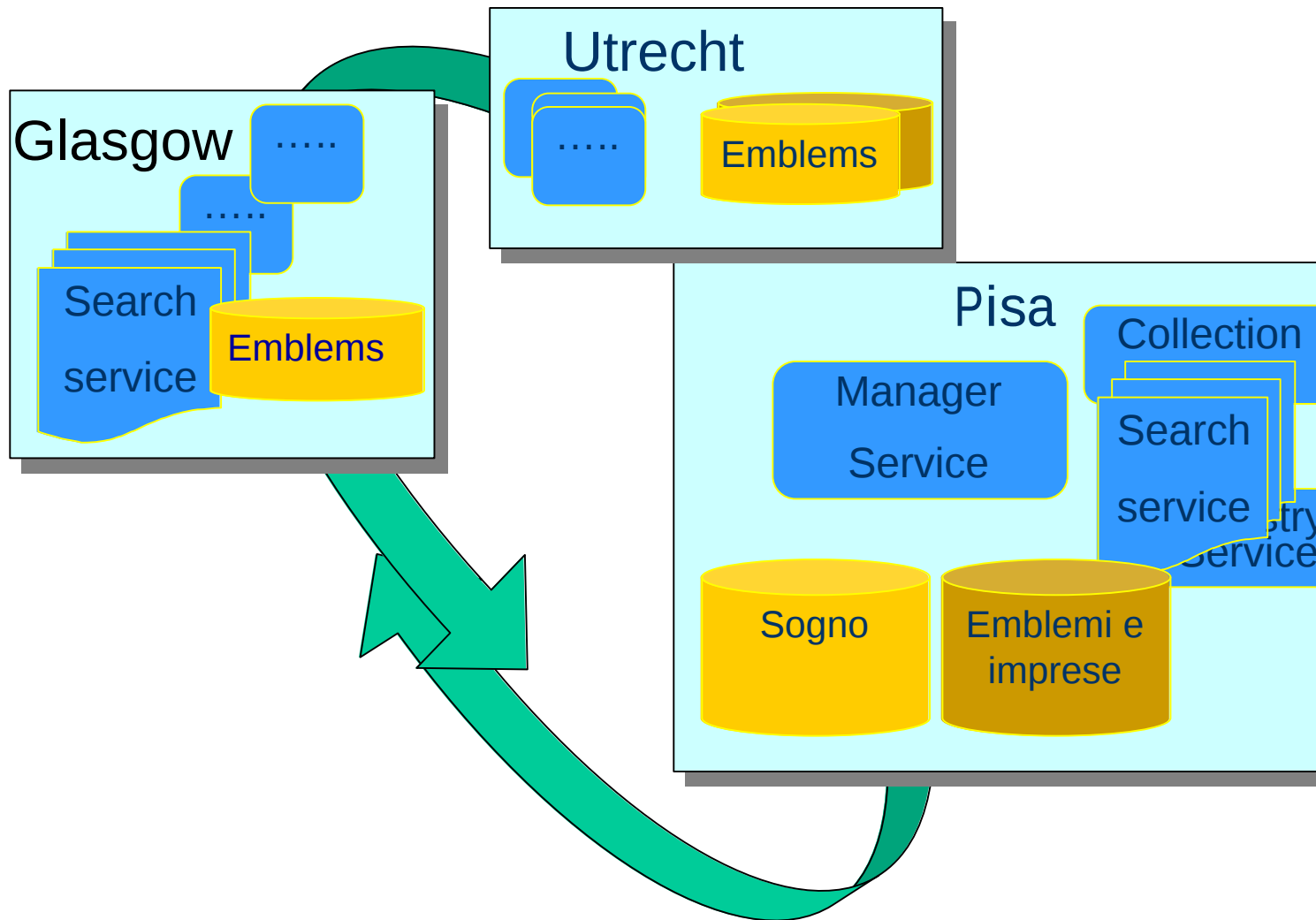
Users access the system through a Web interface

Federated architecture

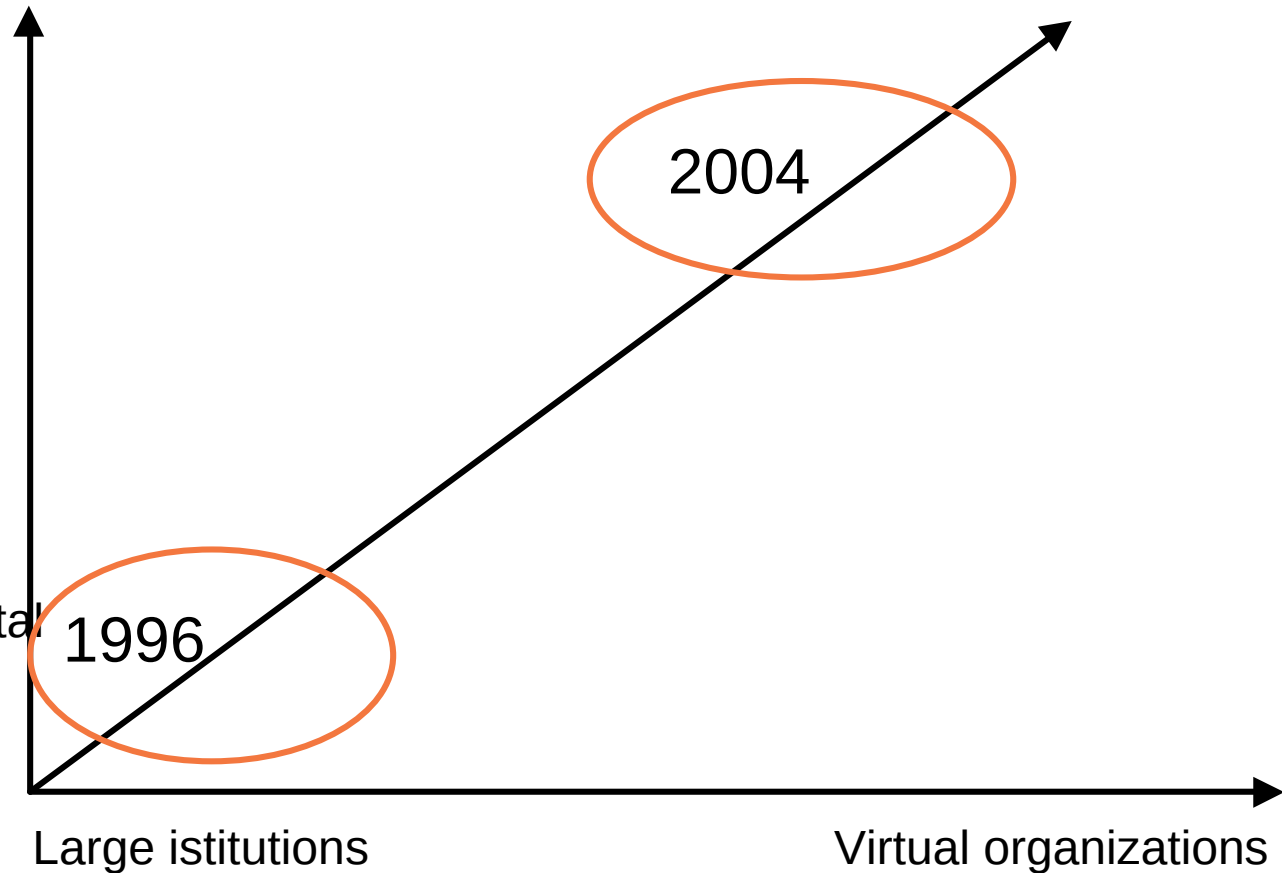

Dynamic Universal Knowledge Environments

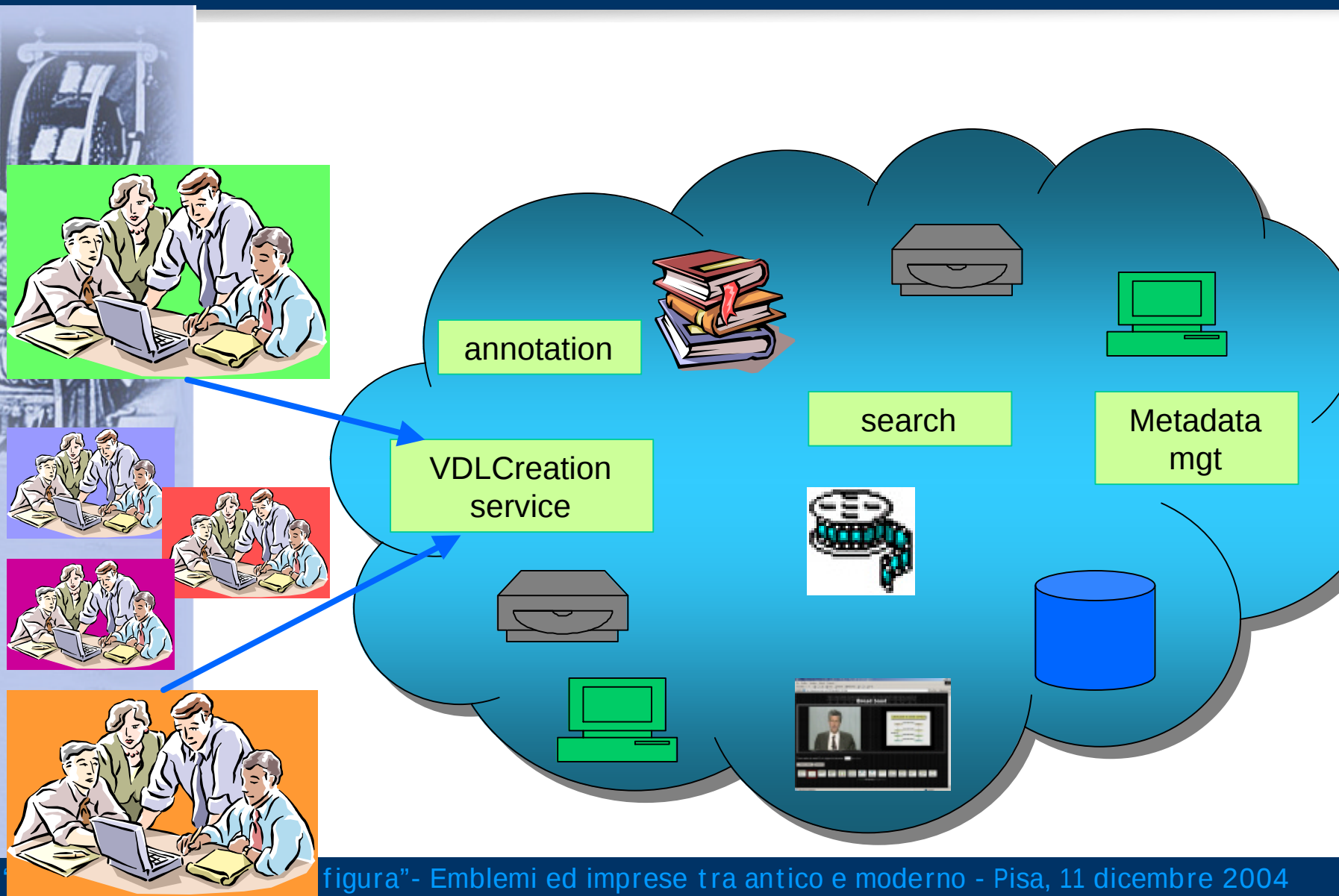


“After approximately ten years of development digital libraries have moved far beyond any connotations of the term ‘library’, to also encompass Digital Archives and Museums and now have functionality to deal with multimedia objects often with embedded general knowledge, semantics and behavior. The potential exists for digital libraries to become the universal knowledge repositories and communication conduits of the future, a common vehicle through which information in all forms can be accessed, discussed, and enhanced.

Digital libraries may thus become the strongest shield of humanity protecting its historic, culture and scientific artefacts from time, natural disasters and human malice.”

- ❖ Controlled sharing of resources will permit to reduce the cost of DUKES
- ❖ High computational and storage capabilities will permit the realization of more powerful services e.g. image similarity search, semantic analysis, automatic content description
