The W3C Office in Italy is organizing the Linked Open Data (LOD) event that will be held in Rome on 20th, 21st February 2014

The "LOD2014" event is centred around a keynote presentations from Phil Archer, a key W3C team member for the Semantic Web and LOD effort, leader of W3C Data Activity. The event will be an opportunity to learn about the latest developments in LOD and related technologies, and on the current thinking about Next Web Technologies. The event will give you the opportunity to know what is going on in the "LOD world".

In these two days we would also want

- to share our Italian experiences regarding the use of Linked Open Data
- to provide information on Best Practices
- to describe the developments and the working groups in the W3C

This event is aimed at experts, public organizations, developers, decision makers and the general public.

Call for Contributions

Talks should describe standards and best practices relevant to the linked open data ideally within the Italian context, such as:

Contributions are solicited in all areas pertinent to the LOD area including:

- Data Cleaning and Integration in LOD

- · Cultural Heritage and LOD
- Gender Open Data
- Geographical LOD
- Graph Database

Speakers are asked to focus on describing practical ways of enabling people to deal with LOD successfully, rather than to focus on technical details or specific products. Given the wide range of topics at the workshop, speakers should also pitch their talk at a level that will be understood by attendees who are unfamiliar with the topic.

Submission guidelines

We will use EasyChair to manage the submission and review process. <u>Get an</u> EasyChair account if you don't have one.

The abstract of your experience should be no longer than 1000 words. A URL related to linked open data or to the application using this data, or a submission of a multimedia document showing its usage is strongly encouraged. Selected contributions will be published on the event site.

Language

The language of this event is Italian, foreign guests will speak English, abstracts and slides can be in Italian or English, for the publication on this Web site English is adviced.
